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Introduction

Welcome to the electronic National Vendor Declaration (eNVD) web platform and mobile app. This guide is designed to help you navigate the different functions of the eNVD system.

eNVD is the fast, easy system for completing all livestock consignment forms digitally. eNVD supports end-to-end electronic transfer of livestock consignments including Livestock Production Assurance (LPA) NVDs, Meat Standards Australia (MSA) Vendor Declarations, National Health Declarations and National Feedlot Accreditation Scheme (NFAS) forms.

Completing an eNVD using either the web or the mobile app is different to using hard copy NVD books. Creating consignments digitally will save you time and effort. It also means livestock consignment information is captured digitally through the supply chain.



eNVD benefits include:

- ✓ Ability to share consignments with other parties with or without internet service
- ✓ Broader supply chain access
- ✓ Ability to comment on consignments
- ✓ Ability to add attachments
- ✓ Easy to read, understand and doesn't get lost
- ✓ Answer questions once
- ✓ Create templates to save time
- ✓ Use on a mobile device and transfer between devices – even without coverage

Important notes on the eNVD system



The eNVD web-based system and mobile app are interchangeable

It is possible to create a consignment on the eNVD web-based system and then open your mobile device and continue to work on it there. The two systems work together in the same way as a banking app does. Consignments created in the app will be accessible from the web-based platform and vice versa.

It is **important** to note that if you have started a consignment on the web-based system and wish to finish it on the mobile app, you **must open the app while you have mobile service or wi-fi connection** and check the draft consignment appears in the list in the app. Refresh your app by closing it and reopening if it is not appearing.

This is important as it ensures the draft consignment is synced across to the eNVD mobile app, complete with any information you entered when you created it on the web-based eNVD system. If you forget to do this, you will need to create the consignment again from scratch on the app and then delete the draft you originally created on the web-based platform.

You must also keep in mind that if you have started a consignment on the web-based eNVD platform and plan to finish it on the app, you should **only sign the declaration once you have opened the consignment in the app**.

Creating consignment forms without internet access

You can create a consignment using the eNVD app without mobile service or a wifi connection. You can complete it and have your transporter complete their details on your device, and then transmit the form to your transporter via the QR code scanning feature. This does not require internet access.

When you submit the form offline, the app will automatically submit the information to the eNVD platform. Once you are back in service, open up your app so the information syncs. **You need to be back in service before the livestock arrive at their destination for the receiver to access the full consignment.** The transporter can only provide the receiver with the consignment summary.

Editing consignments that have been submitted

Once the consignment has been submitted, you can edit the livestock description, transporter details and movement time and date within seven (7) days of the indicated movement date. If any other information is incorrect, the consignment will need to be deleted and a new consignment started. **It is particularly important to ensure the destination Property Identification Code (PIC) is correct as this cannot be changed.** After seven (7) days of the movement date, you will not be able to make any changes to the consignment.

Plan ahead

Some receivers, particularly saleyards, agents and transporters, may not be ready to accept digital consignments.

Before submitting your eNVD, contact your receiver, including your saleyard and agent, to check if they will require a printed copy to be sent with the consignment.

Getting started with eNVD

Before using the eNVD web-based system or Livestock Consignments app, we suggest you refer to the below checklists to ensure you are ready to go:

Not eNVD ready?
You can now share digital consignments with anyone.

- Tap 'View' in the bottom menu to see 'Unsubmitted consignments'
- Tap the three dots (top right corner)
- Select 'Share via email or PDF'
- Select 'Share via email or PDF'
- Select 'Share via email or PDF'

Out of service? You can still receive the consignment via QR code. Open the app and tap 'receive' at the bottom of the screen to open the camera function to scan QR codes.

Managing regulatory inspections
For an authorised officer to review a consignment, open the app, tap on 'View' and tap the three dots and select 'View eNVD'. Alternatively, if the authorised officer has the app installed, you can tap 'Share via QR code' to enable them to scan and view the information on their device.

Deliver the consignment to its destination
Once the consignment is submitted by the producer, the receiver will be able to view the consignment in their app or on the eNVD website without any further requirement from the transporter.

The eNVD Livestock Consignments app is the first, easy system for completing all livestock consignment forms digitally. eNVD supports and streamlines the transfer of livestock consignments including LPS, National Vendor Declarations, Meat Standards Australia Vendor Declarations, National Health Declarations and National Pastoral Accreditation Scheme forms.

The app means transporters can receive and transfer consignment forms online, making the process even easier. The most efficient way to use eNVD is by registering your email address and becoming a myMLA user. Digital consignments mean:

- No damaged or lost paperwork, so all regulatory requirements can be met
- Receive consignments ahead of time direct to your mobile or tablet

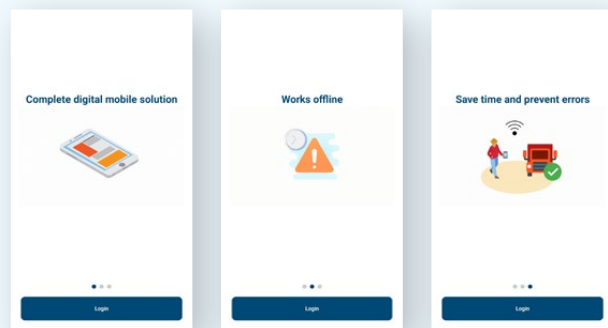


Login to the eNVD mobile app

When you open the app, you'll be prompted to agree to the **Privacy Policy** and Terms of Use. Once selected, tap **Start**.

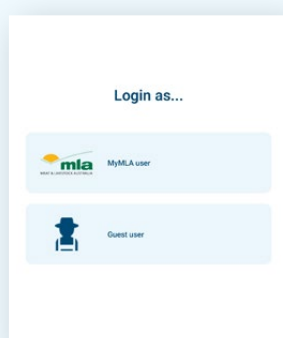


You'll then see these screens reminding you of some of the key features of the app.

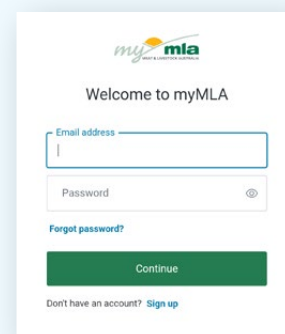


Tap **Login** and you'll be prompted to select the way you want to login. Tap **MyMLA user** – this is the most efficient way to login.

You can login as a **Guest user** if you do not have a myMLA account but functionality will be limited.



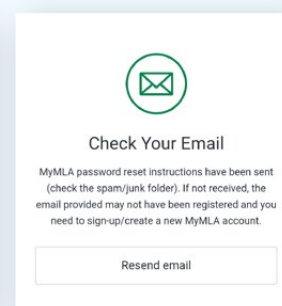
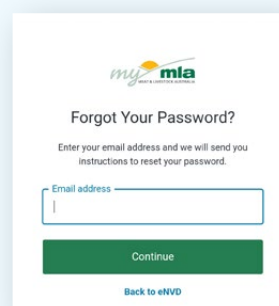
At this screen, enter your myMLA email address and password in the boxes.



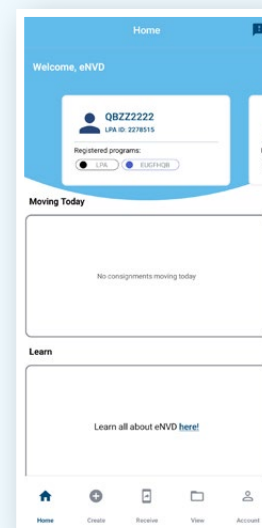
If you have forgotten your password, you can retrieve this by tapping **Forgot password**. Selecting this option will open a new screen, where you will be asked to enter your registered email address.

Entering your email address and then tapping **Continue** will generate a secure reset link that is sent to your email address.

Click the link in the email when you receive it and follow the prompts to reset your password.



Once you have logged in to your myMLA account successfully, you'll start at the 'Home' screen.



Getting to know the eNVD app

Checking your account details

Tap the **Account** option from the home screen while you are logged in.

Under **Settings**, tap **Account**.

At this screen, you can update your name, phone number and vehicle registration number.

If you have multiple PICs associated with your account, you will also be able to select which is your default account. This will be displayed first every time you log into the app.

Sync status

If you have used the app while offline, or have made changes using the eNVD web platform, the app may take a while to open the next time you use it. Data is being synced from the eNVD database to your phone, and vice versa.

Once you have re-opened the app and a sync is complete, you may see one of these status messages.

Your changes were uploaded successfully

Your offline changes to this consignment were uploaded successfully and have overwritten changes made by others while you were offline.

There were some errors while trying to upload

There were some discrepancies with the data that was provided. Please review the consignment and make any adjustments before continuing.

Your changes were discarded due to conflicts

Your offline changes to this consignment were discarded due to conflict. The consignment is now updated with changes made on another device while you were offline.

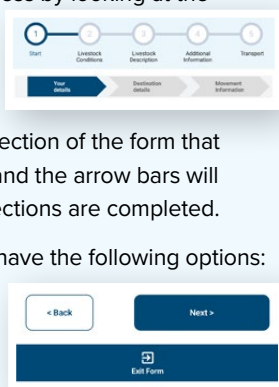
Tracking your progress

As you continue completing eNVD consignment forms using the app, you can keep track of progress by looking at the navigation toolbars.

The numbered circles represent the section of the form. The arrow bars track the sub-section of the form that you are completing. Both the circle and the arrow bars will change colour to dark blue as the sections are completed.

At the bottom of each step, you will have the following options:

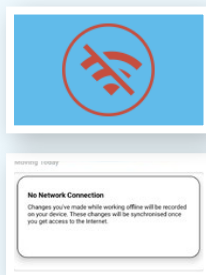
- **Back** will allow you to go to the previous screen and **Next** will allow you move onto the next sub-section.
- **Exit form** will return you to the Home screen.



Offline mode

If you see the red icon at the top of your home screen, this means you are using the app 'offline'.

You can still create and save a consignment while offline. However, before submitting the consignment, you will need to ensure you are back in internet coverage for the consignment to sync to the eNVD database.



Consignment status

The following statuses will be displayed on the consignments shown in the app.

LOCALDRAFT – this draft eNVD was created while the phone was offline and has only been saved locally. You will need to re-open the app when you are online to sync data to the eNVD database.

MODIFIED – you have made edits to an existing eNVD while offline, but the edits have not been synced back to the eNVD database.

DRAFT – the eNVD has been created and saved both locally and in the eNVD database but has not yet been submitted.

PENDING – the eNVD has been submitted while the user is in an offline state and the movement date is today.

SUBMITTED – you have completed all components of the eNVD and it has been submitted to the receiver / transporter. They should now be able to view the consignment in the eNVD system. Edits to the description of livestock and the transporter details can still be made at this stage.

COMPLETED – A submitted eNVD will change to COMPLETED seven (7) days after the movement date. All parties are now able to view this consignment in the system, however, no further edits are able to be made.

Providing feedback

At the top of every screen, the blue feedback icon allows you to provide feedback directly to ISC.



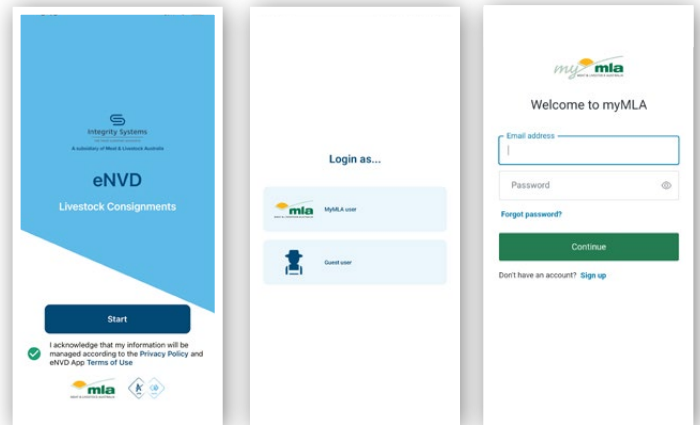
eNVD app: how to create an eNVD

Getting started

The electronic National Vendor Declaration (eNVD) system allows you to complete livestock consignments including the LPA NVD, MSA vendor declarations, national health declarations and NFAS forms. Follow this guide to create an eNVD using the mobile app.

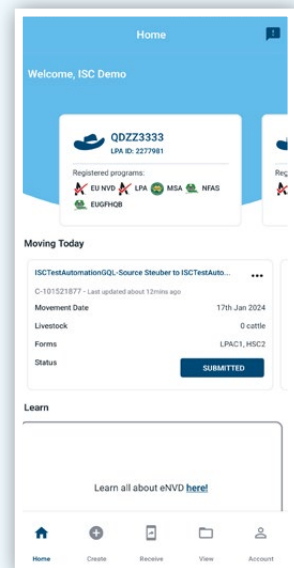
Before using the eNVD Livestock Consignments app, ensure you have registered for a myMLA account and linked your integrity systems accounts. If you're not sure how, find out here: integritysystems.com.au/link-accounts-in-mymla.

Login to the app using your myMLA login details.



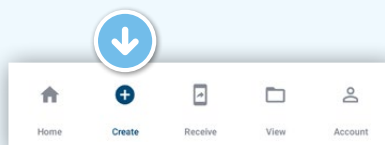
Navigating the eNVD app home page

- 1 Once logged in, you'll start at the **Home** screen.
- 2 You can swap between PICs by swiping the cards at the top of the screen. The cards display icons for each registered program you are associated with.
- 3 Bottom menu options:
 - **Home:** Navigate back to the home screen
 - **Create:** Create a new consignment using the app
 - **Receive:** Open the QR code scanning feature to receive consignments
 - **View:** View existing or past consignments
 - **Account:** View all your account details

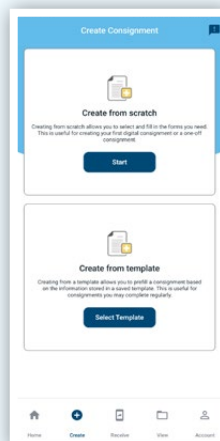


Creating a consignment

Tap **Create** in the bottom menu.



There are two options for creating a consignment - **Create from scratch** or **Create from template**.



Tip: To save time in the future, set up templates for your regular consignment destinations. Follow the steps on pages 22-23 on how to create and use a template.

Movement information

- 1 Enter movement information details for the livestock. The next two screens include:

Owner of the livestock.

Moving the livestock from: the physical location of the livestock. If you have multiple properties linked to your PIC, ensure the correct address is selected.

Moving the livestock to: the physical destination they are being moved to. The full address must be completed.

Consigned to: who the livestock are being consigned to, e.g. an agent or third party. If the agent doesn't have a PIC, you can complete their details manually and leave the PIC field blank. You can also add them as a **Viewer** to the consignment.

Tap **Next** to move between screens when you have completed all the relevant information.

NOTE: Submitting a consignment with an incorrect PIC will mean deleting the consignment and starting again. The PIC cannot be changed.

- 2 You can perform a PIC search to find the **destination PIC** – the same three options also apply when searching for **owner PICs** and **consigned to PICs**:

I've used this owner/destination/consignee before: A list of PICs from the last 10 submitted consignments will be displayed allowing quick selection.

I know the PIC: Users must add the full PIC which will appear in the results to choose from.

I have some details: Use the filter attributes, then further refine by business name from the search results:

- PIC type (All, abattoir, feedlot, saleyard, producer, stock agent, showground)
- State (All, ACT, NSW, NT, QLD, SA, VIC, TAS, WA)
- Town/Suburb or Postcode

Note: Unique messages will be displayed and vary by state, reflecting differences in how each state/territory manages PIC types and data.

- 3 Next, enter **Movement Information** by selecting the date and time. Tap **Next** when complete.

NOTE: The movement date, livestock description and transporter section can be updated for seven (7) days after the consignment is submitted.

Livestock details and forms

- 1 Select the species by tapping one of the animal icons at the top of the screen, then tap **Next**.

- 2 Select the consignment forms you require. A consignment will require at least an LPA NVD. You can then select any additional programs such as NFAS, EU NVD, MSA or health declarations. Tap **Next** to continue.

NOTE: Program names will appear based on the accreditations you hold. If a program does not appear, check your accreditation for that particular program.

- 3 Complete the history, food safety and chemical treatment sections relevant to the consignment. These questions are the same as the paper NVDs you may have previously used.

Tap to view detailed information about each question.

- 4 Some questions require additional information to be provided, for example, details of by-product stockfeeds or chemical treatments. Complete these as required, tapping + for additional entries.

Where relevant, you can upload files to attach to the consignment, for example, in the by-product stockfeeds section. You can upload up to five JPG, PDF, HEIC, HEIF or PNG files, each less than 5MB in size.

Tap **Next** when complete.

Note: If an answer is compulsory, the box will be highlighted red and you will be unable to progress further until you have input the required information.

The first screen asks: "In the past 60 days, have any of these cattle been fed by-product stockfeeds?" with Yes/No radio buttons. Below is a section for "Add details of by-product stockfeeds including the name, date when last fed and analyst report if available". - 5 Fill out all the livestock details including number of head, breed, sex and tag information. The options will vary depending on the type of livestock selected at the start of the consignment.

- 6 You can draw the brand of the livestock (if applicable). To draw the brand, tap + and select **Yes**. A pop-up window will appear, allowing you to use your finger or stylus to draw the brand. Tap **Save** if you are happy with the brand, or **Clear** to redraw it, then tap **Next** at the bottom of the screen once all required information is complete.

- 7 If you have a mixed consignment, scroll back to the top of the Livestock Description screen and tap + to add any additional livestock descriptions and brand information.

Note: If livestock numbers change, you can update the details within 7 days of the consignment's movement date.

Further details, such as tick permits or residue reports, can be uploaded as an attachment on the next screen.

You can upload up to five JPG, PDF, HEIC, HEIF or PNG files, each less than 5MB in size.

If you want to check you have attached the correct image, tap on the file and a preview will open. You can also delete an image by selecting the X next to the filename.

If you are offline, you will not be able to add attachments and will need to wait until you are back online.

Once you have uploaded files, tap **Next**. You can note additional information in the box or tap **Next** to continue.

Declaration

The **Final Summary** screen will now display. This is an opportunity to review all the details included in the consignment. Once you have read the information, tap **Next** to proceed or **Back** if changes are required.

The consignment is almost complete. To finish, you need to complete the 'Declaration' details and select **I have read, understood and agree to the terms**. Then scroll down and tap **Sign**.

Add your signature by writing with your finger. Tap **Clear** to redraw it, otherwise tap **Save**. This will close the signature window and your signature will be added to the declaration. Tap **Next**.

Tap **Save and Exit to Consignments** to save a draft of your consignment to transfer to the transporter later. Otherwise, tap **Enter transporter details** to move to the transporter details screen.

Adding a transporter to a consignment

Transporters can use the eNVD system to manage their consignments and add other drivers to a consignment.

The transporter must have a myMLA registered email address.

If the transporter does not have a myMLA account, follow the steps on pages 15 -17 of this User Guide.

- 1 As you are completing your consignment, tap **Enter transporter details**.

- 2 Add the transporter's myMLA registered email address. If you know the details including name, vehicle registration number and phone number, complete these details. Otherwise, leave these fields blank.

- 3** If you are the livestock owner and transporting them yourself, complete all the details.

- 4 If the livestock are being moved by more than one transporter, tap **Add Transporter** to add and enter each transporter's registered email address.

- When the transporter logs in to their device, they will see the eNVD in their consignment list and be able to complete the rest of the information.

- 6 IMPORTANT!** Make sure to tap **Save** and then **Submit** to transfer the consignment. Once the eNVD is submitted, all receivers using the platform can view a digital copy in their account.

Sharing a consignment with a transporter

offline or no myMLA account



One of the key benefits of the eNVD app is the ability to transfer consignments when there is no mobile signal or internet connection. This guide explains how to share a consignment via QR code. This can be completed between a producer and transporter, or between a transporter and receiver.

This can be used when:

- The transporter does not have a myMLA account, **or**
- You are offline - both you and the transporter have myMLA accounts but have no mobile coverage at the time of transfer.

IMPORTANT notes before you start:

- Both producer and transporter/receiver must have the eNVD app installed on their phones.
- If you have registered for myMLA, you must have previously installed the app and logged in while online.
- You must use the eNVD app, **NOT** your phone's camera, to scan the QR codes.
- **All** of the QR codes need to be scanned for the consignment to be transferred.
- A screenshot of the QR codes will **NOT** ensure compliance.
- When using the app for the first time, you will be prompted to give permission for the app to access your camera. Be sure to select **Allow** to enable access.
- You can receive a consignment via QR codes while offline in **Guest** mode.

Sharing a consignment - transporter's email address added and consignment submitted online:

- 1 Complete the details of the consignment. At the end, tap **Enter transporter details**.

- 2 Add only the transporter's myMLA email address, then tap **Save** when complete. Tap **Submit** to complete the consignment while you are online. This allows the transporter to enter their details on their own device, even if they are offline.

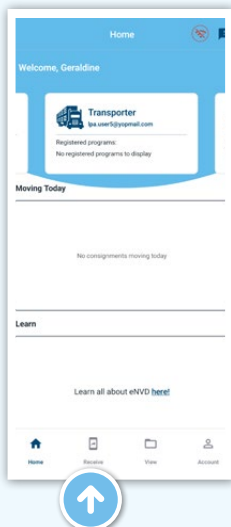
- 3 Tap **Share via QR code**.

- 4 You will now see a series of QR codes. The number of QR codes will depend on the level of detail in your consignment, for example, if you selected additional quality assurance programs.

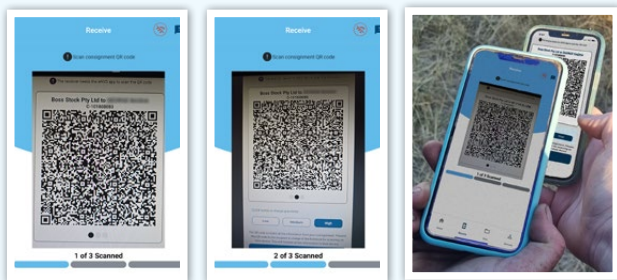
- Have the transporter open the eNVD app on their phone and navigate to **Receive** in the bottom menu. This will open a box to scan the QR codes which appear on the producer's phone.

IMPORTANT

- Use the eNVD app, **NOT** a phone's camera, to scan the QR codes.
- All the QR codes need to be scanned for the consignment to be transferred.
- A screenshot of the QR codes will **NOT** ensure compliance.
- When using the app for the first time, you will be prompted to give permission for the app to access your camera. Be sure to select **Allow** to enable access.

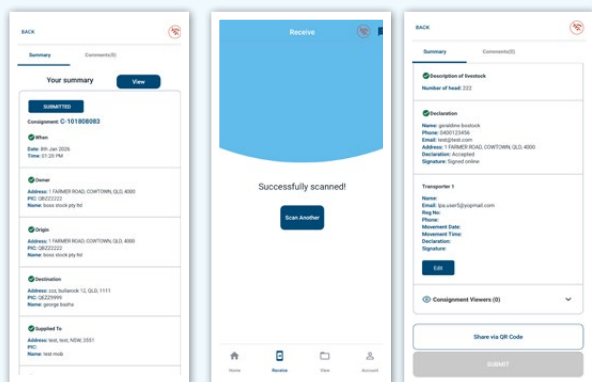


- The grey dots beneath the QR codes demonstrate how many QR codes need to be scanned for that consignment. These will continue to cycle through automatically. As each QR code is scanned, the indicator bar below the camera will change to blue.



- Once all the QR codes have been scanned, the Summary page will display. The eNVD has been successfully transferred to the transporter's device.

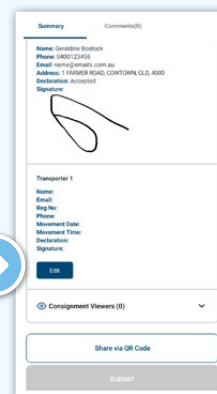
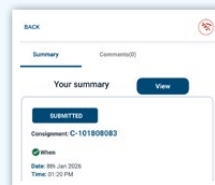
The transporter then needs to scroll down to the **Transporter** section, complete their details, including name, phone number, vehicle registration number, date and time of movement. They also need to tick and sign the declaration.



When you are back in mobile range, open the eNVD app again to ensure the consignment will sync. This ensures all receivers using the platform can view a digital copy in their account.

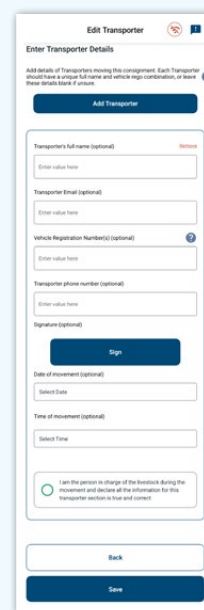
Sharing a consignment - no transporter details added or transporter using guest mode

- Tap **View** to navigate to the consignment list then tap on the consignment you wish to share to view the summary screen. Tap **Edit** on the Transporter information section.



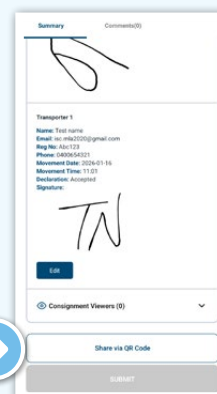
- Have the transporter complete their details on **your** device, including name, phone number, vehicle registration number, date and time of movement. They also need to tick and sign the declaration.

Tap **Save** when complete.

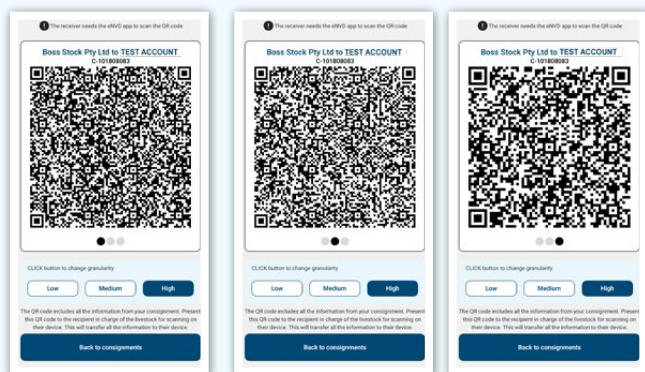


- If the consignment is still in **Draft**, check all the details are correct, scroll to the end and tap **Submit** to transfer the consignment. When you are back in mobile range, open the eNVD app again to ensure the submitted consignment will sync. This ensures all receivers using the platform can view a digital copy in their account.

- Scroll down and tap **Share via QR code**.



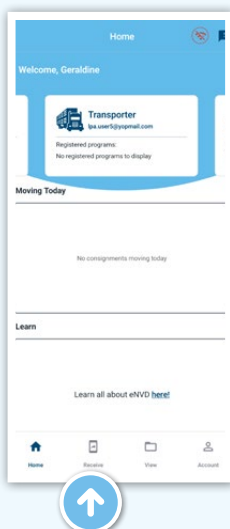
- 5 You will now see a series of QR codes. The number of QR codes will depend on the level of detail in your consignment, for example, if you selected additional quality assurance programs.



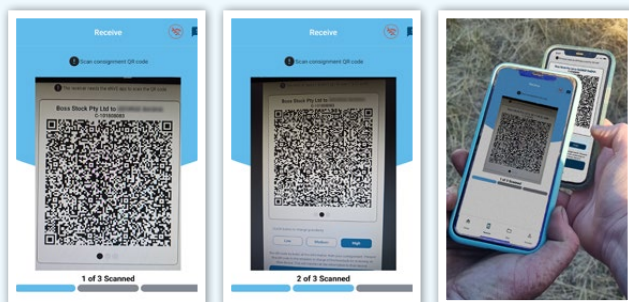
- 6 Have the transporter open the eNVD app on their phone and navigate to **Receive** in the bottom menu. This will open a box to scan the QR codes which appear on the producer's phone.

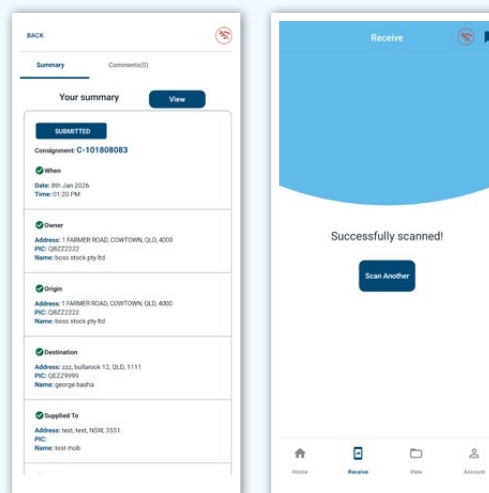

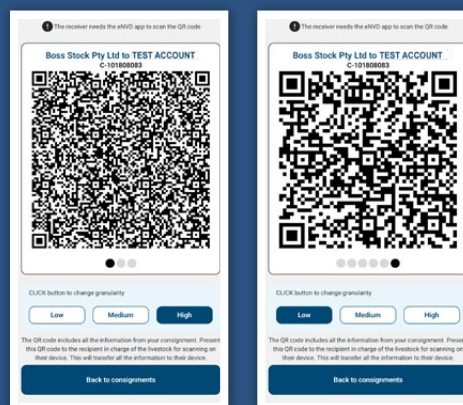


- 9 To share the updated transporter details and any other changes made while offline with other viewers of the consignment, as the consignment creator, you need to open the app again when you are back in an area with mobile signal so the consignment details can sync.

- 10 You can then share the completed consignment with a third party by following any of the additional methods. Refer to separate guides available on this webpage integritysystems.com.au/envd-help/.

Changing QR code granularity

If your device is not reading the QR codes, ask the producer to change the granularity of the codes. By default, the granularity is set to **High**. Tap **Low** and you will notice a change in the appearance and quantity of QR codes to be scanned. This still provides the same information; it just means the device may take longer to scan the additional codes.



How to send a link via SMS or email

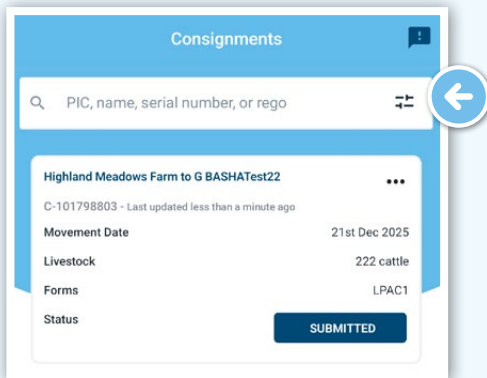
You can only share an eNVD via a link if the consignment is marked as submitted or completed.

Once an eNVD is submitted, all receivers using the platform can view a digital copy in their account, even if the transporter's details are incomplete or missing. If the transporter has not been added, they must print a copy of the eNVD, complete their

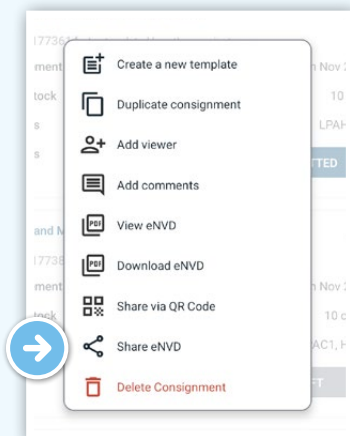
details, and carry this with them on the journey. Follow the steps on page 19 to do this.

To share a link, you must be using the eNVD mobile app. However, consignments created in the eNVD web platform will sync to the mobile app, allowing you to share an eNVD you have created on your computer.

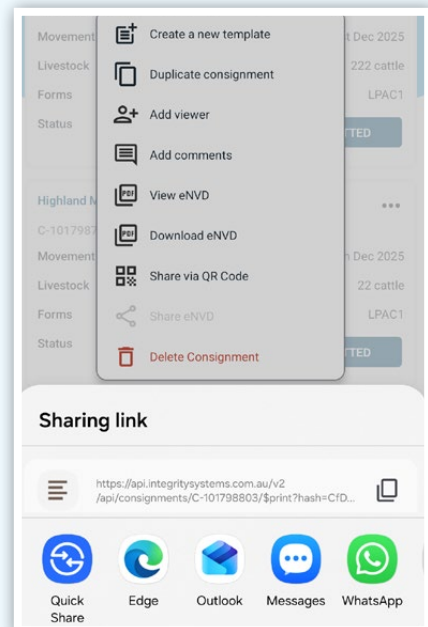
- 1 To share a consignment, navigate to the **View** page and tap the three dots ... next to the consignment you wish to share.



- 2 From the options, tap **Share eNVD**.



- 3 You can then copy the URL and paste it into any messaging platform, e.g. email, SMS, WhatsApp, etc. or select an app from the options on screen.



How to print an eNVD

Before using eNVD, check your transporter and receiver, including saleyards and agents, are ready to receive digital consignments. If your receiver isn't using eNVD, you can still use eNVD.

If you have prepared an eNVD and want to print a copy to share with your transporter, make sure you have **submitted** the consignment. Printed draft eNVDs cannot be used as valid eNVDs - receivers can only accept submitted consignments. Once the eNVD is submitted, all receivers using the platform can view a digital copy in their account, even if the transporter's details are incomplete or missing.

Adding viewers to a consignment

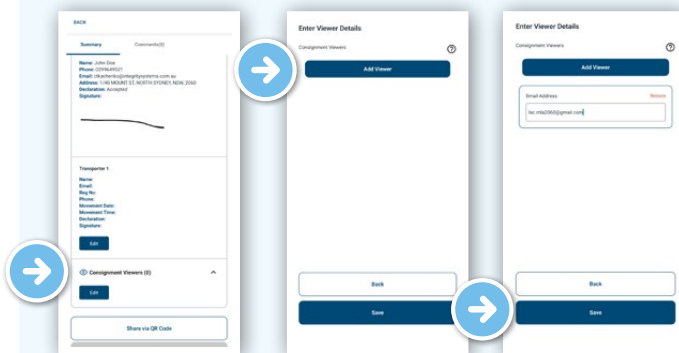
You can add a viewer to your consignment. This allows you to add an agent or a livestock buyer, for example, to the consignment, so they can review, comment and share the consignment. They cannot edit any of the information within the consignment. This is particularly relevant for users who do not hold PICs, particularly agents in Queensland and the NT.

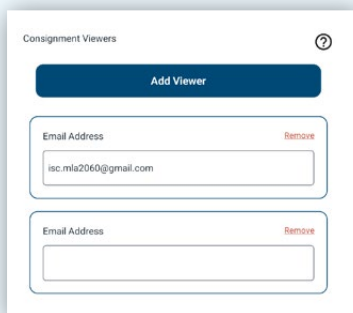
A viewer must have a myMLA account and have set up an eNVD profile.

An eNVD has to be submitted for a viewer to see it - they will not be able to view draft consignments.

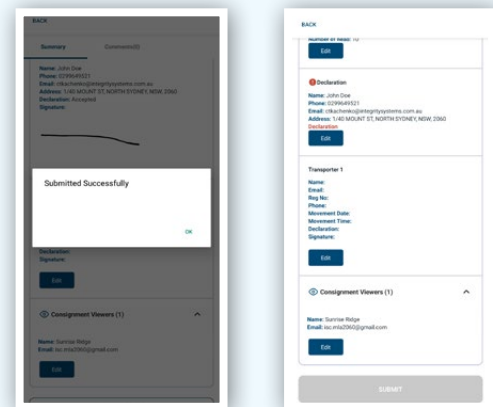
- 1 On the **Your summary** screen, tap the arrow on **Consignment Viewers** and tap **Edit**. Tap **Add Viewer**, enter the email address and tap **Save**.



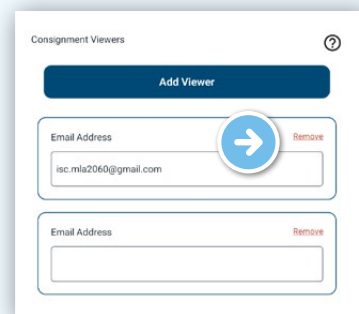

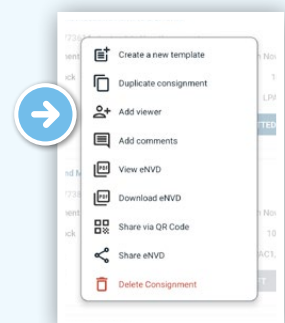

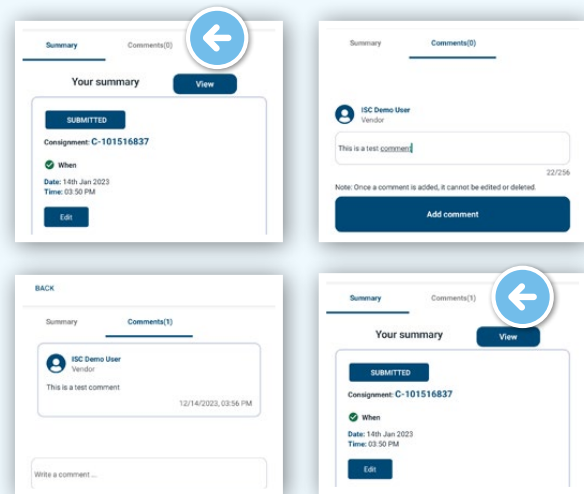

Adding comments

Anyone involved with a consignment - producer, receiver, transporter, authenticated viewers - can add comments to a submitted consignment.

To add a comment, tap to view the consignment summary. At the top of the screen, tap on the **Comments** tab. Tap in the text box at the bottom and add your comment.

Each comment has a character limit of 256 and comments cannot be edited or deleted. When you've added your comment, tap **Add comment**. The tab at the top of the Summary page will now indicate that a comment has been added.

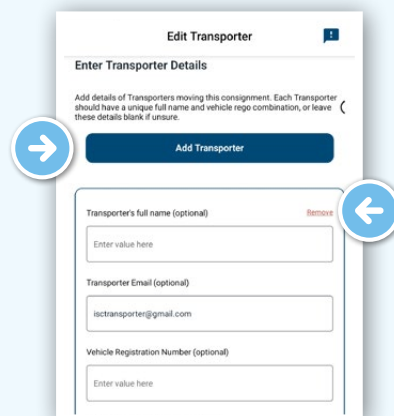


Adding additional drivers

If the load will be transported by multiple trucks, either the producer or yourself as the transporter can assign additional transporters to the consignment.

In the Transporter details section, tap **Add transporter**. Scroll down and complete the second transporter's email address, then tap **Save**. That transporter will now be able to see the consignment in their app, and follow the above steps to complete their details and sign the declaration.

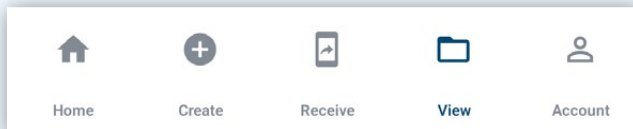
Once a transporter has completed their details and ticked the declaration box, they can no longer be removed from the consignment. However, if a transporter has not yet ticked the box and needs to be removed, tap **remove** in the top right hand corner.



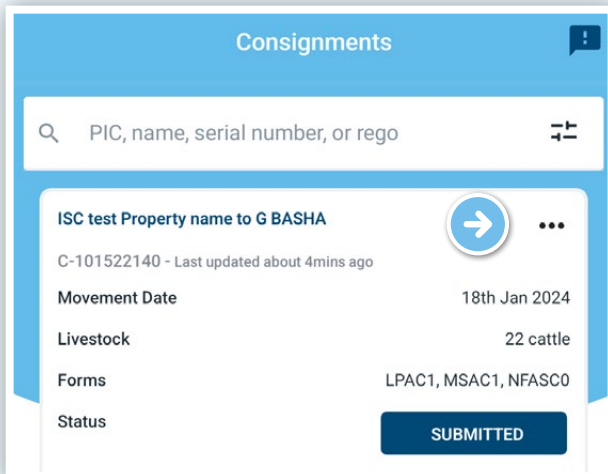

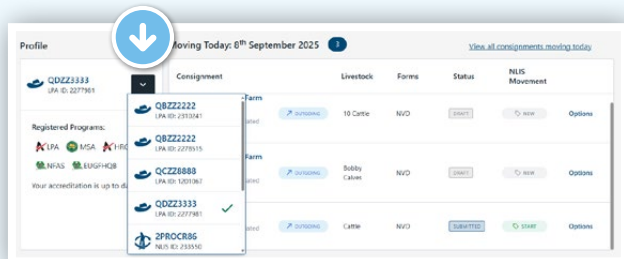

Add NLIS devices to a consignment

Producers can now add RFID or NLIS ID device numbers directly to an eNVD on the web platform, enabling receivers to automatically transfer these devices to their PIC in the NLIS Database. This streamlines transfers, reduces steps, and improves accuracy by allowing receivers to verify device status before livestock arrive.
