

## How to do a PIC reconciliation

Is your National Livestock Identification System (NLIS) account up-to-date? Does it accurately reflect the number of animals on your property?

If you're not sure, then this webinar is for you.

A key way to make sure your NLIS account is upto-date is to conduct a PIC reconciliation. This is a stocktake of all NLIS devices on a property. This process identifies discrepancies between the total number of electronic devices physically on a property and the number of electronic devices registered to that property (PIC) on the NLIS database. Producers are encouraged to do a PIC reconciliation once a year to ensure lifetime traceability of livestock, which helps to keep Australia's red meat integrity system strong.
