How-to: Share geolocation information in LPA

A geolocation sharing tool has been introduced into the Livestock Production Assurance (LPA) program to help cattle producers become compliant with the European Union Deforestation Regulation (EUDR).

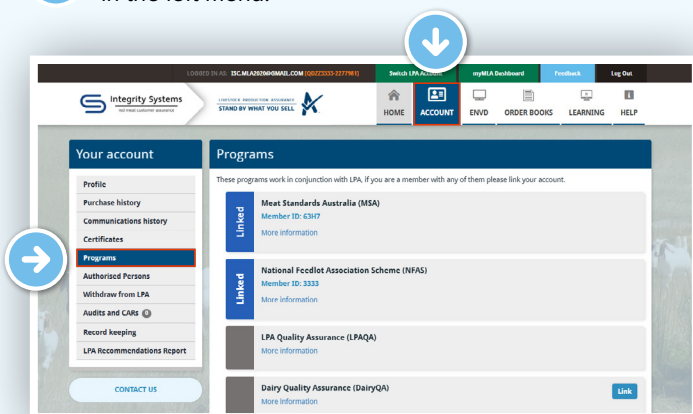
The EUDR aims to limit the EU's impact on global deforestation, forest degradation and biodiversity loss by promoting deforestation-free supply chains.

To comply with these new regulations, Australian cattle producers who wish to have their livestock available to the European market will need to provide their geolocation data (a single latitude and longitude coordinate, to a minimum of six decimal places coordinates) in their LPA account. Follow these steps to share your geolocation.

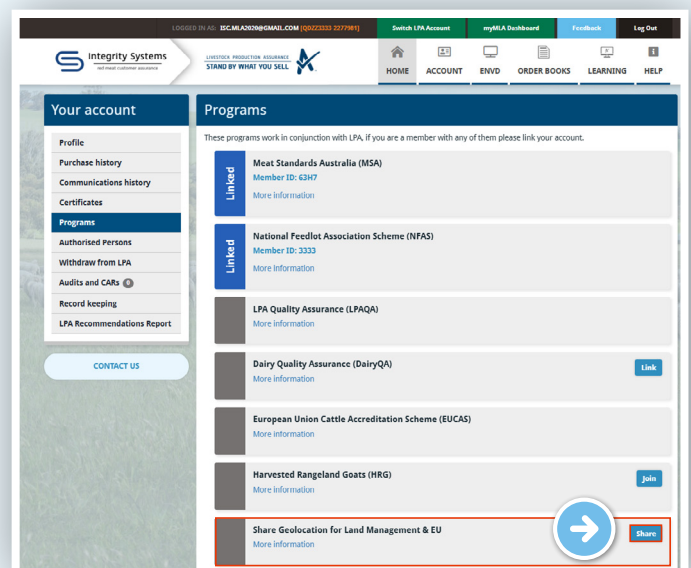
- 1 Log in to your LPA account via myMLA.



- 2 Click **Account** in the top menu, then **Programs** in the left menu.



- 3 Scroll to **Share Geolocation for Land Management & EU** and click **Share**.



4 After reading the instructions, click **Next** to proceed.

Instructions

1. Read and consent to the Geolocation Data Sharing.
2. Using the mapping tool pin the geolocation for your LPA Accredited PIC.

Why do I need to share my geolocation?

Sharing your geolocation is the first step of providing assurance to domestic and international customers Australian red meat is deforestation free.

Additionally, new legislation has come into effect called the European Union Deforestation Regulation or the EUDR which requires beef, beef products and leather and hides to be free from deforestation and illegal land degradation.

The key requirements of the EUDR that impacts livestock producers is that:

1. The land cattle have been kept on from birth to slaughter must not have been subject to deforestation or forest degradation since 31 December 2020.
2. The geolocation coordinates of where cattle have been kept from birth to slaughter for each consignment must be provided to the importer.
3. Australian cattle producers who wish to continue to trade beef into the EU will need to provide their geolocation (latitude coordinate and longitude coordinate) to enable exports to continue.
4. Leather and hides can come from any cattle in Australia so even if you are not in the European Union Cattle Assurance Scheme (EUCAS) sharing your geolocation will ensure the trade of Australian leather and hides to the EU continues.

Geolocation Data Sharing Agreement

- I understand that I am responsible for identifying and submitting accurate geolocation data, and I acknowledge that the information will be used to assist with compliance under Regulation (EU) 2017/2455 on deforestation-free products (EUDR) and any related requirements I consent to.
- I acknowledge that my geolocation data will be combined with other information I have permitted and to be shared with authorised individuals accessing the NLIS database to confirm Lifetime Identification, traceability and geolocation data.
- I am aware that I can withdraw my permission to ISC's use and sharing of this data at any time, and upon doing so, my request will be promptly actioned.
- I confirm that I have reviewed and agree to the terms outlined in the collection notice, and I consent to the collection, use storage and disclosure of my geolocation data in accordance with the conditions specified in this notice agreement.
- I hereby declare that, to the best of my knowledge and belief, the production of the relevant commodities complies with the applicable laws and regulations of the country of production, specifically addressing the following:
 - Land use rights;
 - Environmental protection in line with federal, state, and local laws;
 - Forest-related rules, including forest management and biodiversity conservation, where relevant to wood harvesting;
 - Third-party rights;
 - Labour rights.

6 A map will be shown, allowing you to confirm a single latitude and longitude point that represents the LPA accredited PIC where your livestock are kept. If you are happy with the location, click **Save and continue**, or follow the instructions on screen to move the pinpoint.

Follow the step-by-step instructions to confirm the single latitude and longitude point that represents your LPA Accredited PIC where livestock are kept.

Step 1: The map will default to the property address listed on your LPA account.

If you wish to change the address, enter it into the search bar. If your location cannot be found using the entered address, use your mouse to navigate to your property on the map. The 'w' button can be used to zoom in or out of the map.

Step 2: Using your mouse, left-click to select or move the red pinpoint on the map. This pinpoint will be the geolocation point saved for this property.

Step 3: Select 'Save and continue' to save your selection.
