Food safety, quality and traceability are important to red meat consumers around the world.

The red meat integrity system ensures Australian red meat is

- ✓ Safe to eat
- ✓ Fully traceable
- ✓ High quality

The red meat integrity system has two programs that link to ensure you can stand by what you sell.

Livestock Production Assurance (LPA) incorporates on-farm management of food safety, animal welfare and biosecurity risks.

The **National Livestock Identification System (NLIS)** tracks the location of every animal throughout its life.



Make sure you're meeting your livestock management, identification and traceability requirements:

- ✓ Manage your property and livestock according to LPA requirements
- ✓ Complete your NLIS transfers
- ✓ Ensure every NVD is clear, complete and correct
- ✓ Keep accurate records

Property Identification Code (PIC) — required for all livestock-producing properties



Maintain your online
LPA account.



Maintain your online
NLIS account.



Complete LPA accreditation
every three years.



Order NLIS devices.



Use LPA NVDs for all
movements. Make sure they
are clear, complete and correct.



Apply NLIS devices to your
livestock. Follow state/territory
requirements.

LPA NVDs — link on-farm assurance and traceability when animals are moved



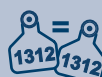
Manage property and
livestock according to the
seven LPA requirements.



Ensure all movements on and
off your PIC have been recorded
on the NLIS database. Double
check transfers by third parties
have been done on time.



Maintain current and accu-
rate farm records.



Complete a PIC reconciliation
annually to ensure total active
tags matches your tagged
stock and spare tags total.



Participate in LPA audits
as required. All records
(including your NLIS
transfers) will be reviewed
as part of your LPA audit.



Action any database
notifications promptly.
